*"Alexa, are there any school messages?"*

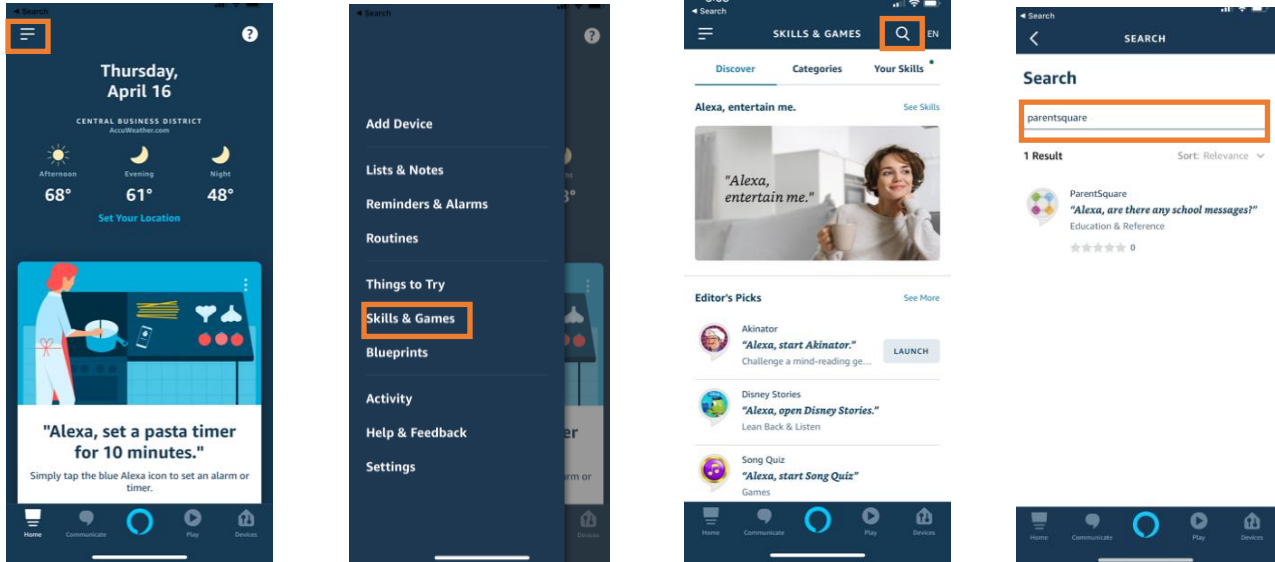

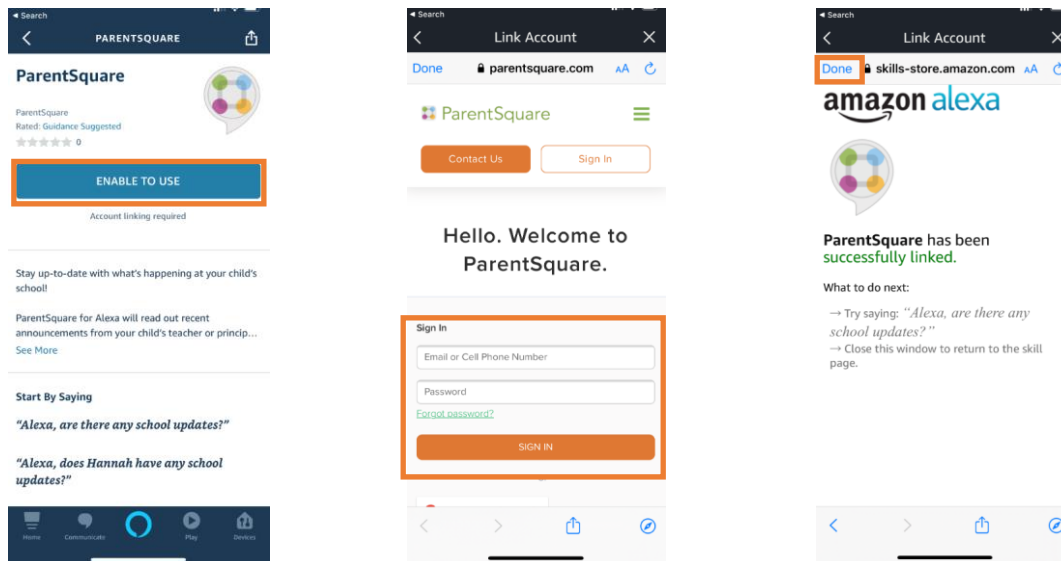

## ParentSquare Skill Setup Guide

1. Open the Alexa Mobile App. If you do not have the app, you can download it from your phone's app store by searching for "Amazon Alexa."
2. Click the navigation bar on the top left corner, then select "Skills and Games." Within "Skills and Games," click on the magnifying glass at the top right corner and enter "[ParentSquare](#)" into the search bar. Then, select the ParentSquare skill in the search results.



3. Then on the skill page, click "Enable To Use." Next, enter your ParentSquare user name and password and click "Sign in." Once signed in, you will see a confirmation that your ParentSquare account successfully linked. Tap "Done" to close the window.



4. Want to control who can access your ParentSquare skill on Alexa? Set up Limit Access and Alexa will verify your voice before providing a response. To set up Limit Access, go to the ParentSquare skill settings page within the Alexa mobile app and click on "Settings." Next, toggle on the "Limit Access" to green. From here, you will be prompted to set up a voice profile along with a 4-digit passcode.
