

Prohibited items

Use this guide to ensure you are not shipping prohibited items or dangerous goods. Use our [Dangerous Goods Identification Guide](#) to learn more about identifying dangerous products.

We prohibit the delivery of:



Dangerous or hazardous goods

Perishable items, including hampers with perishable contents

Age-restricted goods such as alcohol

Please ensure you check our full list below before shipping, as it may differ from your other shipping service providers:

Remember

These goods and packages are prohibited for shipment via Amazon Shipping ("Prohibited Shipments").

Amazon does not agree to provide the Services in respect of any Prohibited Shipments and expressly reserves all its rights under the Terms or otherwise in relation to any Prohibited Shipment.

Shippers who ship prohibited items may have their shipping paused or terminated.

Illegal items: Items not permitted for sale and/or transportation by applicable laws, rules or restrictions, including without limitation counterfeit goods, illegal drugs and weapons.

Age-restricted goods or goods requiring age verification or signature on delivery, including without limitation alcohol and bladed products.

Perishable items that require specific conditions for transport and storage, including without limitation perishable goods which are not "shelf stable", for example fresh fruit or temperature-sensitive goods such as dairy or frozen products, plants (excluding fresh cut flowers and live potted plants not intended to be replanted), live animals (including insects and animal embryos).

Hazardous or dangerous items: Items classified as hazardous materials, dangerous goods, prohibited goods, banned articles or restricted articles by any of (i) the European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR); (ii) the International Air Transport Association Dangerous Goods Regulation (IATA DG Regs); (iii) the International Maritime

Dangerous Goods code (IMDG) or (iv) by any applicable government department or other relevant organisation.

This includes without limitation Shipments containing any quantity of: (i) aerosols; (ii) compressed gases; (iii) corrosive substances; (iv) equipment or devices containing or packed separately small lithium batteries, e.g. laptops, tablets and mobile phones, or large lithium batteries, e.g. hover-boards and e-bikes, or stand-alone batteries; (v) explosives; (vi) fireworks; (vii) items or substances labelled with any diamond symbols (other than the irritants or harmful substances symbols); (viii) party poppers; (ix) perfumes; (x) toxic substances; (xi) transport restricted chemicals, including stronger cleaning products, which may be corrosive, flammable, harmful to the environment or toxic; (xii) other flammable or incendiary items.

Paints and varnishes: Water-based paints, wood varnishes and enamels with a volume greater than 150ml per item.

Leaking or odorous: Packages that are wet, leaking or emit an odour of any kind.

Firearms and/or ammunition.

Bearer form negotiable instruments, share certificates and blank shares, contracts, deeds, lottery tickets, vouchers, stamps, duty stamps and any other documents negotiable or equivalent as cash; bullion, money or coins of any description.

Precious metals and stones and semi-precious stones or items that are made from or include the foregoing. "Precious metals" means silver, gold, platinum, palladium, iridium, osmium, rhodium and ruthenium, "Precious stones" means diamonds, emeralds, rubies and sapphires. "Semi-precious stones" means amethyst, aquamarine, aventurine, carnelian, garnet, lapis lazuli, opal, pearls, rose quartz, topaz and tourmaline.

Human body parts: corpses, organs, body parts, embryos, or cremated or disinterred human remains.

Magnetised metals with a magnetic field strength greater than 0.418A/metre at a distance of 4.6 metres from the outside of the package.

Pornography.

Prescription medication.

Any items expressly prohibited for the specific ship method you select, as notified to you by Amazon in Shipper Central or otherwise, and any other items that, at our discretion, we decide Amazon Shipping cannot deliver.
