CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Special care has been taken in designing and creating your LACOSTE Jewelry item; to maintain their radiance and shine, however, the jewelry must be properly maintained. Please read the following information and instructions carefully to learn about the features and proper care of your new piece of jewelry.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Your jewelry should be the finishing touch to your outfit and come off first at the end of the day. We advise keeping your jewelry separately in its original packaging or in the specially designed pouch, as the surface of the metals and the brilliance of the stones can become dull as a result of impacts. You may use a soft, lint-free cloth to maintain its shine over time. Please do not drop or expose to extreme conditions and avoid any contact that may cause scratches or chipping. We recommend avoiding direct contact between your jewelry and fragrance, household chemicals or similar products. Direct contact with water (showering, bathing, swimming in fresh, salt or chlorinated water) should also be avoided.

STAINLESS STEEL

Stainless steel is naturally highly resistant to corrosion (when it comes to water and humidity). As stainless steel does not oxidize or tarnish, you are recommended to maintain it by gently cleaning it regularly with a soft cloth.

LEATHER

Leather should be kept dry. Exposure to water may cause the leather to become brittle and eventually break. To preserve the finish of the leather, contact with fragrances should be avoided. Following exposure to chlorinated or salt water, gently damp wipe your leather jewelry with fresh water (no cleaning products containing alcohol or solvents), and air dry.

SILICONE/RUBBER

To help preserve the natural elasticity and quality of your silicone or rubber jewelry, rinse it using a soft cloth soaked in fresh water following exposure to salt water, chemicals, or abrasive substances.

Use warm water and a neutral pH soap applied to a soft cloth to gently clean a white silicone or rubber piece of jewelry; then wipe with a second clean cloth dipped in warm water, or rinse carefully under warm running water. Contact with acetone and ethyl alcohol should be avoided.

STONES

Dust, pollution or simply daily wear may naturally, over time, have an impact on the appearance of the stones and their setting. In some extreme cases, it may result in the loss of a stone. However, some basic care can help avoid this situation. To protect your jewelry, we advise you not to wear it in extreme temperatures or during extreme activities. We recommend using a soft brush and warm water to gently remove any dirt or grease.

HANDLING & RING SIZES

PUSH (OR CLIP) CLASP

They work like a miniature version of a snap hook or a climbing karabiner. Using your finger or fingernail, push the hinge from the outside-in to open the clasp. The opening will allow you to hook the jewelry piece. Note that the hinge cannot be opened from the inside.

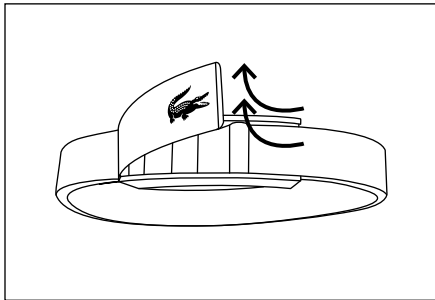
LOBSTER CLASP

This type of clasp resembles the claw of a lobster. To open the clasp, simply press down on the small lever, which is found on the side of the claw. While continuing to hold down the lever, you may pass the other end of the jewelry (usually a loop ring) through the opening, onto the hook. Release the lever to close.

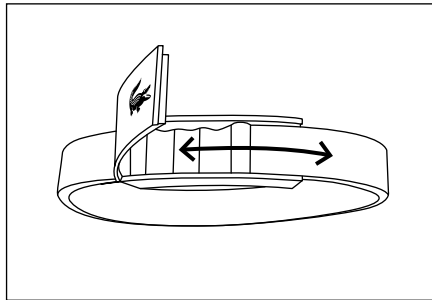
MAGNETIC CLASP

Some bracelets are held together by magnets. Having the top of the clasp facing towards you, simply apply downwards pressure to the smaller end of the bracelet – forcing the clasp to split open. You will feel slight resistance from the magnets. To close, bring both ends of the bracelet together.

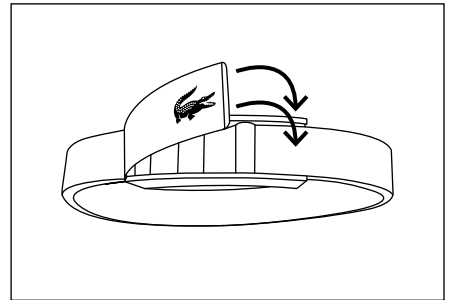
SIZABLE CLASP



Open the bracelet by lifting the top part on the right-hand side



Adjust the guidelock to the desired length



Firmly push to close

BANGLE CLASP

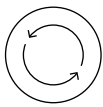
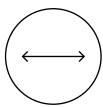
Hold your bangle with the closure facing you, one thumb on each side. Push with one thumb and pull open with the other one.

RING SIZES

This guide will allow you to measure your ring size.

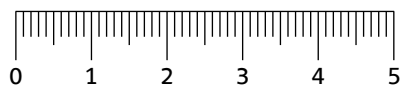
You may take a well-fitting ring from your collection and measure the diameter of the inside of your ring. Simply place a ruler in mm or inches, horizontally across the ring's edges to determine its diameter.

You can also directly measure your finger. Simply measure the circumference of your finger in mm or inches (where you prefer wearing your ring) using measuring tape. Alternatively, use a piece of paper (or string), wrap it around your finger and make a mark precisely where both ends meet. Finally, measure the length of the paper (or string) – this will determine the correct circumference.

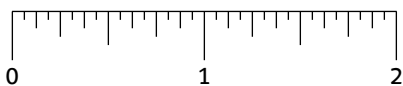

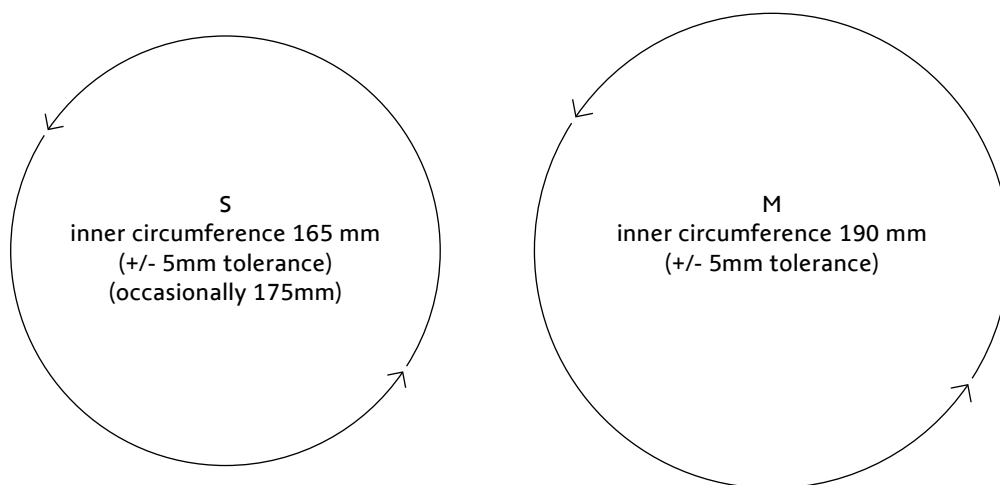

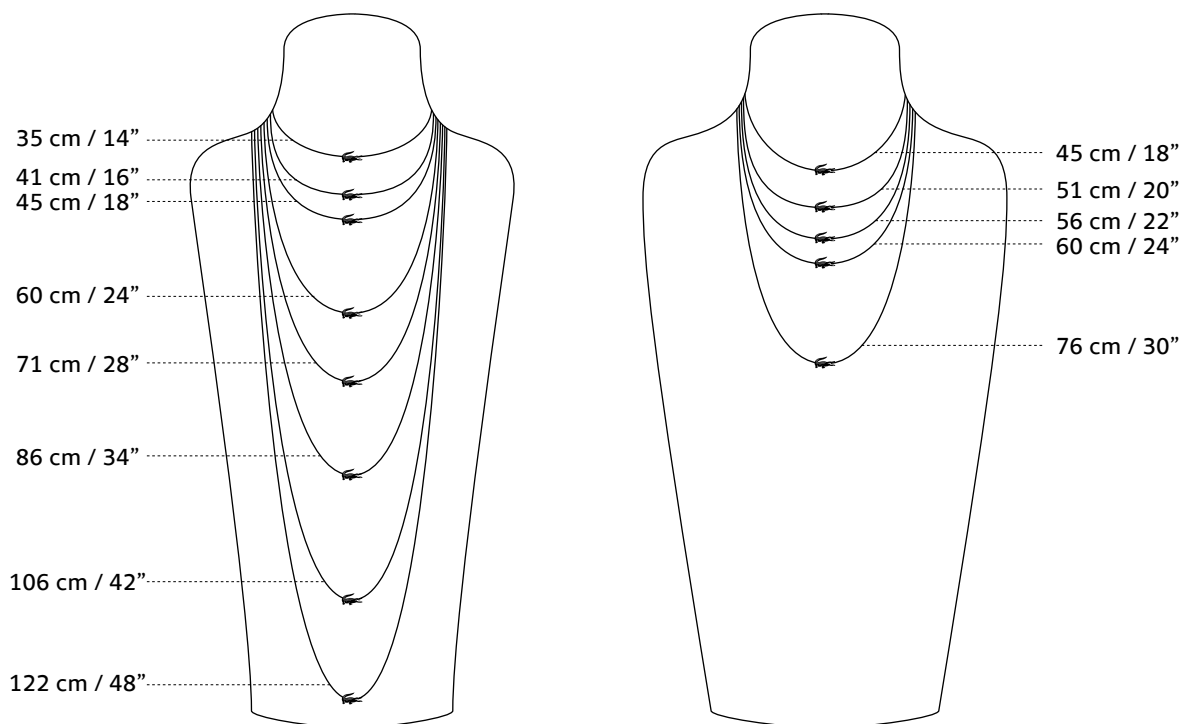
BRACELET SIZES

This guide allows you to measure the bracelet width you need. You can print this document on A4 paper to place an existing bracelet on top and match your inner circumference. Alternatively, you can measure your wrist with a piece of paper or a string as explained in the previous section.

OBTAINING SERVICE

Should your LACOSTE Jewelry require service or repair, you may take it to an Authorized Jewelry Dealer, or mail it directly to one of the LACOSTE Jewelry Authorized Service Centers found on this website – just return to the LACOSTE Jewelry service website home page and click on the Service Information link. Be sure to include your complete return address and phone number along with a brief note describing the problem with your jewelry and/or service needed. A written estimate will be sent for your approval and payment before the work is undertaken.

PACKING YOUR JEWELRY

When mailing your jewelry, it should be packed securely in padded wrapping materials (for protection against shock) in a sturdy box sealed with tape. CAUTION: Do not use the gift box your jewelry came in. It was not designed to withstand shipping, and your jewelry could be damaged in transit.

INSURING YOUR JEWELRY

We recommend that you use registered mail and insure your jewelry for its full replacement value.
