Weber Grills

There are a variety of grates on Weber grills. The version of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** required depends on which model you have.

Both versions are available in two materials - Stainless Steel and Brass.

The Stainless Steel versions of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** are stronger and longer-lasting.

The Brass versions were specifically created for porcelain-coated or Teflon-coated grates.

Weber grills have one of four different grates depending on the model - a round grate, a flattop grate, a crowned-top grate or a rectangular grate.

Weber Grills

The universal versions of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** (part numbers S4480 and S4490) work excellent on the round grates and flat-top grates.

They can clean the crowned-top grates and rectangular grates but if that is your only grill, buying a scraper specifically designed for it may be preferable.

The standard versions of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** (part numbers S4420 and S4430) work excellent on the round grate versions.

They do not work on the flat-top grates, crownedtop grates or rectangular grate versions.

Here is a breakdown of the grate style each Weber grill model has:

Brass vs Stainless Steel

The Brass versions of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** are specifically designed for use on Teflon and Porcelain-coated grill grates.

Brass is softer than stainless so it will not scratch the surface of coated grill grates.

The Stainless Steel versions of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper** are designed for use on chrome-plated, stainless steel, cast iron or any old, rusty, crusty grill grates.

Stainless steel is extremely durable so it will take years of abuse - outlasting brass, aluminum, and wooden grill scrapers.

Brass vs Stainless Steel

What if you don't know which style of grates you have?

The rule of thumb is to purchase brass if your grill grate is black and to purchase stainless steel if your grill grate is grey, silver or rusty.

One deviation from this rule of thumb is that cast iron grates are occasionally black.

Cast iron is easy to distinguish as it has a rough, textured finish and most other grates have a smooth finish.

Cast iron grates require the stainless steel version of **The Sage Owl Grill Scraper**.
