

Use the dowels to join the two base pieces. Attach to the post with screws.



## Ultimate Training Tips

1. Place the post in a room where the cat spends a lot of time. Cats often like to stretch and scratch when they wake up from a nap.
2. Use catnip to lure your cat to the post. Rub the catnip onto the sisal material and call your cat over to the post.
3. Scratch your nails along the surface of the material. This will attract the cat and at the same time teach him where to scratch.
4. After your cat begins to scratch, praise him and give him a food treat. Small kittens can be trained to climb the post by showing them food treats and placing it at the top of the post.
5. If your cat has already been scratching a piece of furniture, place the post directly in front of it.
6. Temporarily cover the previously scratched areas with a few strips of double-sided carpet tape. This will help redirect your cat's scratching activities to the post.
7. Most cats are easily trained; if your cat is the exception, however, please see [www.catsinternational.org](http://www.catsinternational.org) for free behavior counseling.
