

User Manual of Product 1:

Russell Hobbs 20460 Quiet Boil Kettle, Brushed Stainless Steel, 3000W, 1.7 Litres

User Manual of Product 2:

Russell Hobbs 24080 Adventure Two Slice Toaster, Stainless Steel, 2 Slice, Brushed and Polished

BOIL DRY PROTECTION

1. This will shorten the life of the element. A boil-dry cut-out will switch the kettle off.
2. You must then remove the kettle from its stand to reset the cut-out.
3. Sit the kettle on the work surface till it's cold.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

1. Unplug the stand, and let the kettle cool before cleaning.
2. Wipe all surfaces with a clean damp cloth.
3. Keep the connectors dry.
4. Open the lid.
5. Push the hook on top of the filter down then lift the filter out of the kettle (fig A).
6. Rinse the filter under a running tap while brushing with a soft brush.
7. Lower the filter into the kettle, and engage the bottom hook in the bottom of the spout.
8. Press the top of the filter towards the kettle, to lock the hook in place.
9. Close the lid.

Descalc regularly, at least monthly

The suppressor is designed to reduce the noise made by the boiling water. If you allow scale to build up, it won't be able to work properly, and the kettle will become noisier.

Descalc the appliance at least monthly with a proprietary descaler.

Follow the instructions on the package of descaler.

Products returned under guarantee with faults due to scale will incur a repair charge.

Avoid spillage on the stand/connector.

The surface of the heating element is subject to residual heat after use.

BEFORE FIRST USE

Fill to **max**, boil, discard the water, then rinse. Do this twice to remove any manufacturing dust, etc.

FILLING

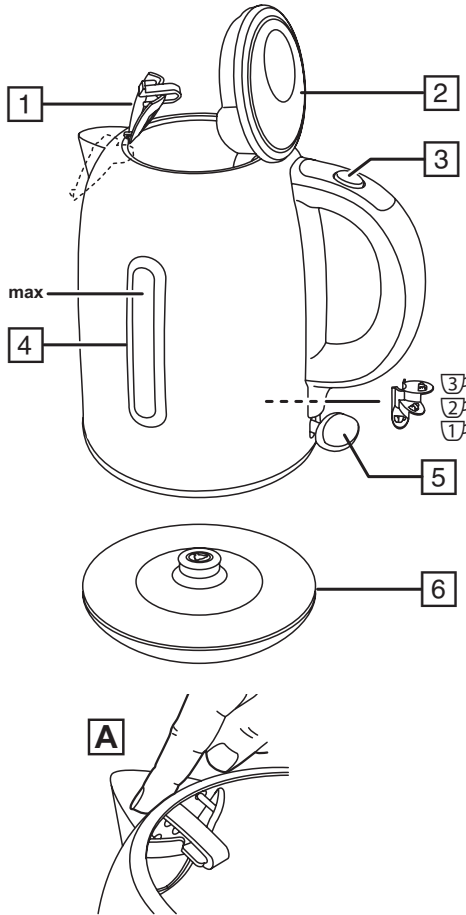
1. Remove the lid.
2. Fill with at least 1 cup of water, but not above **max**.
3. If you want only 1, 2, or 3 cups of water, fill to the 1, 2, or 3 marks inside the kettle.
4. Refit the lid.

USING YOUR KETTLE

1. Put the stand on a stable, level surface. Wind excess cable beneath the stand.
2. Plug the stand into the wall socket.
3. Put the kettle on the stand.
4. Move the switch to **I**. The light will come on and the kettle will start to heat.
5. When it boils, the kettle will switch off.
6. To switch off manually, move the switch to **O**, or simply lift the kettle off the stand.

GENERAL

When you lift the kettle, you may see moisture on the stand. Don't worry, it's the steam used to switch off the kettle which is allowed to escape via vents under the kettle.



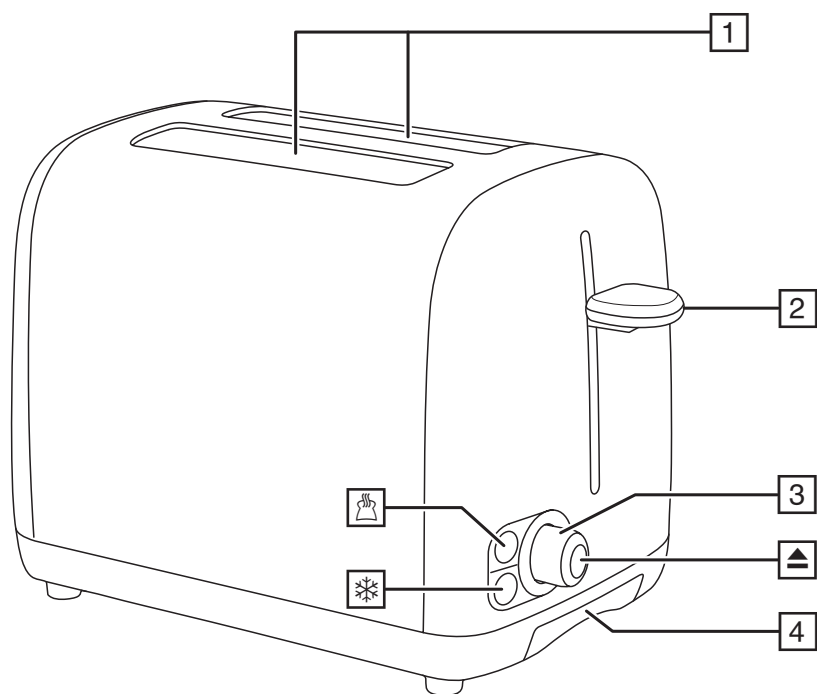

Don't connect the appliance via a timer or remote control system.

Bread can burn therefore do not use the appliance near or below combustible materials such as curtains. Never use the appliance below wall cupboards or shelves.

Do not leave the appliance unattended while it is in use.

 The surfaces of the appliance will get hot.

Remove and empty the crumb tray regularly. Wipe with a damp cloth, dry, then replace in the toaster.

If the cable is damaged, return the appliance, to avoid hazard.

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

- staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
- by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;
- bed and breakfast type environments;
- farm houses.
- ⊗ Do not use this appliance near bathtubs, showers, basins or other vessels containing water.
- Don't toast or reheat bread that is too thick, buttered, torn, or misshapen.
- Take extra care when toasting items that contain sugar, jam, seeds, currants, etc. These can melt or drop into the toaster and cause overheating or fire.
- If bread gets jammed, unplug the toaster, let it cool, and carefully remove the bread.
- Never use a knife, fork or any other implement to remove jammed bread. As well as potentially damaging the toaster, there is a risk of electric shock!

BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME

1. Set the browning level to maximum.
2. Operate the appliance empty, to cure the new elements.
3. This may smell a bit, but it's nothing to worry about. Ensure the room is well ventilated.

TOASTING

Toasting involves exposing bread to a controlled heat, which causes a chemical reaction called the 'Maillard Reaction'. This doesn't just brown the bread, but alters the flavour and texture, which is why toast tastes so good!

Since toasting is a combination of drying then cooking the bread, it is affected by various factors such as differences in the bread's thickness, freshness and surface texture. Local and regional variations in household electricity voltages can also have an effect on toasting time which is why we would advise to initially try different toasting settings in order to find your perfect shade of toast.

TOASTING BREAD

1. Sit the toaster upright on a firm, level, heat-resistant surface.
2. Put the plug into the power socket.
3. Turn the browning control to the required setting (1 = light, 6 = dark).
4. Put bread into the toasting slots (maximum thickness 26mm).
5. Press the lever down fully. It won't lock down unless the toaster is connected to the electricity supply.
6. The  light will come on and the elements will heat up.
7. When it's done, the toast will pop up.
8. To stop toasting, press .
- You may raise the lever further, to remove small items.

FROZEN BREAD

1. Leave the browning level at your favoured setting, insert the frozen bread, lower the lever, then press .
2. The  light will come on, and the toasting time will be altered automatically to give the same degree of browning you get with unfrozen bread.

REHEATING TOAST

1. Leave the browning control at your favoured setting, insert the bread, lower the lever, then press .
2. The  light will come on, and the toast will be given a short burst of heat.
3. Don't reheat "battered", torn, or misshapen bread.

HINTS AND TIPS

- Old (yesterday's) bread has less moisture, so makes crisper toast.
- Old bread, thin slices, and sweet bread products (tea cakes, fruit loaf, etc.) brown faster – use a lower setting.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- Unplug the toaster and let it cool down.
- Wipe outer surfaces with a damp cloth.
