

FRUIT FLIES



Your fruit flies were stuffed in a box for a couple days. They may not look their very best right now.


Here are some solutions to issues the cultures typically experience during their days in the box.

Where are the flies? It is very common to not see any flies when your culture arrives. Often times the adult flies die in transit (of old age), but don't worry! Josh's Frogs guarantees the first batch of hatching fruit flies 1-3 days after arrival.

The media is all over inside of the culture: If the culture gets warm the media gets soupy. The media will fall back to the bottom of the culture over the next couple of days and your culture should continue business as usual.

I see mold inside of the culture: When the media dries out it molds. Simply add some water and the mold will go away in a couple of days and your culture should produce as normal.

Care Basics

Josh's Frogs recommends keeping the cultures in a plastic drawer system and/or humid room to prevent them from drying out. If you do notice the cultures are drying out (or molding), spray with RO Water. To limit grain mites, keep older cultures (over 28 days) away from newer cultures.
