





# **OUICK START GUIDE**

#### UNPACKING THE GROOMING KIT

- 1. Unpack the FurFluff Pet Grooming Kit. Compare the item in the kit to the components shown in the WHAT'S IN THE BOX section on pages 4 and 5.
- 2. Place the appliance on a flat, sturdy surface.

# ATTACHING AND REMOVING THE HOSE

- To Attach: Press the green hose-release latch to lift it, insert the hose into the vacuum connector (white) or the blow dryer connector (gray), and release the latch. See Figure 1.
- To Remove: Press the hose-release latch to lift it and remove the hose from the connector.



## INSTALLING AND REMOVING AN ATTACHMENT

- To Install: Align the notch in the base of the attachment with the attachment-release button on the end of the hose. Slide the attachment onto the hose; it will click into place. See *Figure 2*.
- To Remove: Press the attachment-release button and pull the attachment to remove it.



# REMOVING AND REINSTALLING THE DUST BIN

- To Remove: Power off and unplug the appliance. Grasp the end of the dust bin and pull it up and out to remove it. See *Figure 3*.
- To Reinstall: Insert the dust bin into the appliance by pressing lightly in and down. The dust bin will click into place when properly installed.



# MANAGING THE HOSE AND POWER CABLE

When you are done using the appliance, always secure the hose and power cable to avoid creating a tripping hazard or damaging the appliance.

- Hose: Wrap the hose around the body of the appliance. See Figure 4.
- Power Cable: Bundle the power cable and secure it with a zip tie. Do not wrap the power cable around the body of the appliance to avoid damaging it.



# BEFORE GROOMING: DESENSITIZE YOUR PET

It is important to properly prepare your pet for grooming, especially if your pet is anxious or nervous, is sensitive to loud noises, or has never been to the groomer. For detailed instructions on how to use your FurFluff Pet Grooming Kit, see **OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS** on page 10. Please note, that while some pets may tolerate completing all of the desensitization training steps below in one day, some pets may need several days or weeks until they feel comfortable enough to begin using the grooming kit. Don't rush! Rushing through acclimating your pet can result in negative associations with grooming and grooming tools. Reward your pet with treats, toys, and lots of praise or for remaining calm as you introduce each grooming desensitization step below.

- 1. Unpack the grooming kit and leave it out for a few days to allow your pet to check it out.
- 2. Get your pet comfortable with brushing and being handled:
  - a. If you do not regularly brush your pet, begin brushing them a few times a week for 5–10 minutes at a time.
  - b. If your pet is anxious about being touched in sensitive areas, gently handle and massage them to help them get used to being touched in all areas.
  - c. If you have never trimmed your pet's nails, help them prepare for nail trimming by frequently touching their paws, pads, and nails.
- If you have a small or medium-sized pet, you may find it easier to groom them on an elevated surface, such as a large, sturdy table. Always place a non-slip mat on the table to keep your pet from slipping or falling.
  - a. Have your pet get up onto the table, give them a treat, and then have them get off of the table.
  - b. Repeat a few times, gradually increasing the time you have your pet stay on the table.
- 4. Get your pet acquainted with the noise of the appliance:
  - a. Turn on the appliance to the lowest intensity when your pet is in the same room.
  - b. Repeat this several times gradually bringing the appliance closer and gradually increasing the intensity level to see how your pet tolerates the increased noise and proximity.
- 5. Once your pet can tolerate being near the appliance while the motor is turned on, it's time to help them get used to the grooming attachments.
- 6. Get your pet acquainted with the grooming and multipurpose brushes:
  - a. Turn on the lowest vacuum level and brush your pet with slow, short strokes from neck to tail.
  - b. Next, brush your pet's sides, belly, and legs.
- 7. Get your pet acquainted with the blow dryer:
  - a. Turn on the lowest blow dryer level. With the heat off and no nozzle installed, blow air on your pet's feet or hindquarters for a few minutes.
  - b. Try blowing air on your pet's sides and chest. Be careful not to blow air in your pet's face.
- 8. Get your pet acquainted with the electric clipper:
  - a. Run the clipper, with the power off and the longest guard installed, through your pet's hair.
  - b. Turn on the clipper and allow your pet to see and smell it. Turn the clipper off and run it through your pet's hair again. Repeat several times as needed.
  - c. Turn on the clipper and trim a small section of your pet's fur to see how they tolerate it.
- 9. Get your pet acquainted with the nail grinder:
  - a. With the power off, touch the grinder to a nail and give your pet a treat. Repeat with each nail.
  - b. Turn on the grinder and allow your pet to see and smell it. Trim one nail and give your pet a treat. Repeat until all nails are trimmed.

## HOW TO APPROACH GROOMING IF YOUR PET IS PRONE TO ANXIETY OR NERVOUSNESS

- Take your pet on a long walk or run or give them extra playtime before a grooming session.
- Stay calm and be patient. Your pet can sense if you are anxious or nervous.
- Use the lowest suction and blower intensity levels to keep the noise level low.
- Work slowly and take breaks frequently to avoid overwhelming your pet. Try brushing one section of hair or trimming the nails on one paw at a time, then pause to reward your pet for staying calm. Keep grooming sessions short and positive, only doing as much as your pet will tolerate calmly. Break grooming tasks into multiple sessions.
- Have another adult work with you to distract your pet and keep them calm and still with treats.
- Play calming music. Classical music has been found to have a calming effect on anxious pets.
- Try a pheromone spray or diffuser, aromatherapy, or anti-anxiety food or treats.
- Try pet ear muffs or noise-canceling headphones.
- Talk to your veterinarian for advice and strategies for your pet's particular needs.
- Be alert for, and always heed, any signs of distress. When distress signals go unnoticed or ignored, pets can react aggressively out of fear.

# WHAT TO DO IF YOUR PET SHOWS SIGNS OF DISTRESS DURING GROOMING

- Stop and take a break. Distract your pet by going for a long walk or giving them a favorite toy to play with. Some pets may prefer, instead, to calm down in a quiet, safe space.
- If your pet is still distressed after taking a break, work on desensitization training for a day or two before trying grooming again. Refer back to the steps on the previous page.
- Never punish your pet or forcefully groom them, as this will only reinforce negative associations with grooming and could lead to aggressive behavior.

#### SIGNS YOUR DOG IS DISTRESSED

- Your dog yelps, whimpers, or appears fearful, agitated, or stressed.
- Your dog shows signs of distress including yawning, lip licking, drooling, shaking, whining, excessive licking or chewing on fur, shedding copiously, pacing, backing away, or trying to hide.
- Your dog's ears are lowered, their tail is tucked between their back legs, or their hackles are raised.
- Your dog displays new aggressive behavior, such as snarling, growling, lunging, snapping, or biting and shaking.
- Your dog begins to eliminate in the house (and this was not a previous behavioral issue).

# SIGNS YOUR CAT IS DISTRESSED

- Your cat shows signs of mild to moderate anxiety including, avoiding eye contact, shifting their body or head away from you, flicking their tail or holding their tail tightly against their body, partially dilated pupils, ears partially to the side, increased breathing rate, or crouching or leaning away.
- Your cat shows signs of severe anxiety including, trying to run away, fully dilated pupils, ears back, raised hair, or behaving aggressively towards people or other pets.

# **OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS**

▲ **WARNING!** This product is not for use with aggressive animals. Do not use this product if your pet is prone to aggressive behavior. Aggressive pets can cause severe injury to their owner or others. If you are not sure that this product is right for your pet, please talk to your veterinarian or a professional groomer. Stop using the product immediately if your pet begins behaving aggressively.



- Heat Level LEDs (Red): The red LEDs light up to indicate the selected heat setting, low, medium, or high. One lit LED indicates low heat, two LEDs indicate medium heat, and three LEDs indicate high heat. The LEDs are off when the heat is off.
- 2. Heat Button \$\\$\\$: Press to toggle through the three heat levels, low, medium, and high, when using blow dryer mode. The heat is off by default. Please note, the heat function is not available when using vacuum mode.
- 3. **Power Button** (1): Press to turn the appliance on and off. The button LED lights up when the power is turned on.
- 4. **Blow Dryer Mode Button ?**: Press to turn on blow dryer mode and toggle through the three blower intensity levels, low, medium, and high. The default intensity is low.
- Suction/Blower Intensity LEDs (Blue): The blue LEDs light up to indicate the current suction/blower
  intensity, low, medium, or high. One lit LED indicates low intensity, two LEDs indicate medium
  intensity, and three LEDs indicate high intensity. The LEDs are off when both the vacuum and dryer
  are off.
- 6. **Vacuum Mode Button** ?: Press to turn on vacuum mode and toggle through the three suction intensity levels, low, medium, and high. The default intensity is low.

#### USING THE GROOMING BRUSH



- 1. Connect the hose to the vacuum inlet and attach the grooming brush attachment to the hose.
- 2. Press the **Power** () button on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- 3. Press the Vacuum Mode W button to turn on the suction. Low suction intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 4. Brush your pet slowly and gently with short strokes from neck to tail. Then brush your pet's sides, belly, and legs.
  - a. Brush in the direction of the hair growth and keep the brush head flat against your pet's body.
  - b. Use caution to avoid irritating your pet's skin with the brush's wire pins.
- 5. When the brush starts to get full of hair, press the **Self-clean button** on the back of the grooming brush attachment to remove hair from the bristles and suck it into the vacuum hose. See *Figure 6*.
- 6. Turn off the appliance, unplug it, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.

#### **NOTES**

- Always start by brushing dry fur with the grooming brush. If you encounter knots or mats that cannot be easily untangled with short, gentle strokes of the grooming brush, switch to the multiuse brush with the deshedding or dematting brush head. See the next section for details.
- You can spray your pet's hair with a bit of detangling spray or leave-in conditioner, as these products can help make the brushing process less painful for your pet, prevent hair breakage, and make detangling easier.
- If your pet tries to bite the brush, run away, or hide, you may be brushing too hard or the vacuum intensity may be set too high. Try using the lowest vacuum level and brushing more gently.
- It's best to avoid using the grooming brush on your pet's face, paws, and other sensitive areas, as the wire bristles can be uncomfortable. Instead, use the multiuse brush with the deshedding brush head.
- Regular brushing has many benefits for your pet, including removing loose hair, trapped dirt and debris, and dead skin cells; preventing mats and tangles; reducing shedding; and distributing the hair's natural oils for healthy skin and a shiny coat. Brushing gives you a chance to regularly inspect for unusual skin bumps, lumps, or irritation, as well as fleas, ticks, and other parasites. Brushing is also a great time to pamper and bond with your pet.

# **USING THE MULTIUSE BRUSH**





- 1. Spray knots and mats with a small amount of detangling spray to help relax the hair. Then use your fingers to loosen the hair and isolate the mat.
- 2. Connect the hose to the vacuum inlet and attach the multiuse brush attachment to the hose.
- 3. Attach the deshedding or dematting brush head. See Figure 7.
  - a. Insert the hooks on the bottom edge of the brush head and then press the top edge into place.
  - b. The small arrow on the brush head will point up when installed properly. See Figure 8.
- 4. Press the **Power**  $\bigcirc$  **button** on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- 5. Press the Vacuum Mode W button to turn on the suction. Low suction intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 6. Use extra care and very short strokes when detangling with the multiuse brush attachment.
  - a. Use one hand to hold the base of the mat or knot to avoid pulling or tugging painfully on your pet's skin as you brush. Avoid direct contact with the skin or applying pressure to the brush.
  - b. Start by brushing the ends of the hair and working your way slowly toward the skin.

- 7. Press the **Self-clean button** on the back of the multiuse brush attachment to remove hair from the brush head so it can be sucked into the vacuum hose. See *Figure 7*.
- 8. Press the Brush-head Release button on the top edge of the brush to remove the brush head.
- 9. Turn off the appliance, unplug it, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.

#### **NOTES**

- The dematting brush head is best for removing mats and large tangles. The deshedding brush head is great for removing loose hair from the undercoat to reduce shedding; it's also perfect for smaller knots and tangles and brushing double coats. The upholstery brush head is designed to pick up pet hair off of upholstered furniture and clothing. See CLEANING UP on page 17.
- Always start with dry fur. Trying to detangle wet fur can cause hair breakage and worsen knots.
- Go slow and be patient! Take lots of breaks and reward your pet with plenty of treats and praise.
- Mats are most often located in the armpits, at the base of the tail, behind the ears, under the collar, on the belly, and in other areas where friction occurs.
- Regular brushing and haircuts are the best ways to avoid mats. Small knots and tangles can grow into large mats if left unattended. Matted hair can cause your pet significant discomfort and distress, and may also cause skin irritation and sores, infections, and other skin problems.
- Never shave or cut out mats as you can accidentally cut your pet's skin. If the mats are so large you think cutting them out may be necessary, it's time to seek the help of a professional groomer.

# **USING THE BLOW DRYER**

#### **↑** WARNINGS

- Avoid pointing the nozzle in any area for longer than a few seconds to avoid burning your pet's skin.
- Keep a careful eye on your pet to make sure they do not overheat. Depending on the size and breed of your pet, you may want to switch between low heat and no heat to avoid overheating. If your pet displays any of the following signs or symptoms: panting or drooling excessively, vomiting, rapid heart rate, diarrhea, or lethargy, they may be experiencing heat exhaustion; seek advice from your veterinarian immediately.
- Avoid blowing air directly into your pet's eyes, ears, nose, mouth, or near their genitals, as this may cause your pet discomfort. When drying near sensitive areas, use the lowest blower level and no heat. You may also consider removing the nozzle to further diffuse the strength of the airflow.



- 1. Connect the hose to the blow dryer outlet and attach the flat-wide or comb nozzle to the hose.
  - a. The wide-flat nozzle concentrates airflow to dry hair quicker.
  - b. The comb nozzle allows you to comb through hair while drying to help minimize tangles.
- 2. Press the **Power button** on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- 3. Press the **Blow Dryer Mode** button to turn on the blower. Low blower intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 4. Press the **Heat \$\footnote{1}\$** button to turn on the heat function. Low heat is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium heat. Press a third time for high heat.
- 5. Hold the nozzle at least a couple of inches away from your pet's hair and slowly move the nozzle to dry their coat. See *Figure 9*.
  - a. Angle the dryer nozzle so that your pet's fur blows straight away from the end of the nozzle to blow water away from the body and avoid tangles.
  - b. Generally, it's best to dry your pet from top to bottom.
  - When using higher heat settings, make sure to hold the nozzle further away and avoid lingering in one spot for long periods to avoid burning your pet.
- 6. Turn off the appliance, unplugit, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.

# **NOTES**

- We recommend using low heat or no heat for puppies and pets with sensitive skin or hair that is prone to heat damage.
- Always towel dry your pet before blow drying them, as the towel will absorb more than half of the water held in their coat and significantly reduce the drying time. Avoid rubbing your pet's hair with the towel as this can cause knots and tangles. Instead, drape a thick, clean towel around your pet and press or gently squeeze a section of hair at a time. Allow dogs to shake as this can further reduce the drying time.

# USING THE ELECTRIC CLIPPER

#### **↑** WARNINGS

- The clipper blades are very sharp; use caution when handling the clipper and blades to avoid injuring yourself, others, or your pet. Keep fingers, all body parts, and clothing away from the blades.
- Use extra caution when trimming around your pet's eyes, ears, nose, mouth, paws, genitals, in areas with extra skin folds, and in bony areas such as joints to avoid cutting or scratching their skin.
- Always use an appropriate clipper guard to avoid cutting or scratching your pet's skin.
- Be sure to always keep the clipper blade flat against your pet's body. Holding the clipper at an angle may result in cutting or irritating your pet's skin.
- Be sure to frequently stop and turn off the clipper to check the blade for heat. If the clipper blade begins to feel too warm, allow it to cool before resuming to avoid burning your pet's skin.
- If you are trimming your pet on an elevated surface, make sure to properly secure them to the table to ensure they are not able to jump off and injure themselves. Never leave your pet unattended while on the grooming table.
- 1. Connect the hose to the vacuum inlet and attach the electric clipper attachment to the hose.
- Select the desired clipper head. Slide the clipper head onto the installation post inside the attachment base. Then, install the desired clipper guard. See Figures 10 and 11.





- 3. Press the **Power button** on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- Press the Vacuum Mode ♥ button to turn on the suction. Low suction intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 5. Press the green **Power button** on the clipper to turn it on.
- 6. While keeping your pet as still as possible, use a slow, steady combing motion through their hair.
  - a. Trim in the direction of the hair growth. Make sure to pay close attention because the direction of hair growth can change in different areas of the body.
  - b. Do not apply a lot of pressure to the clipper to avoid accidentally trimming large chunks of hair or hurting your pet.
- 7. Once you have trimmed your pet's fur to the desired length, brush their coat to find any uneven spots and re-trim where needed.
- 8. Press the **Power button** on the clipper to turn it off. Turn off the appliance, unplug it, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.
- When completely cool, clean the clipper with the included brush. See CARE AND MAINTENANCE on page 18.

# **NOTES**

- Have styptic powder on hand in case you accidentally scratch or cut your pet's skin. Wipe away blood with a clean dry cloth and apply styptic powder, as directed on the product, to superficial cuts to stop the bleeding. Monitor the treated area to ensure the bleeding has stopped and to check for signs of infection such as redness, swelling, and irritation. Contact your veterinarian with any concerns.
- Ensure the clipper blade is clean and sharp before use.
- Only trim your pet's hair when it is clean, dry, and carefully brushed to remove any tangles and mats.
- Use the large clipper blade when trimming large areas of hair and use the small detail blade for trimming around your pet's paws, face, sanitary areas, and other sensitive areas.
- Always start with the longest guard, especially when you are first learning to use the electric clipper to avoid getting an uneven cut or inadvertently trimming the hair too short. The longest clipper guard provides the largest distance between the electric clipper and your pet's skin and results in the longest haircut. The shortest clipper guard will result in the shortest haircut.
- If you have never trimmed your pet's hair before, we recommend seeking guidance from your veterinarian or a professional groomer before attempting to do it yourself. Trimming techniques and frequency will depend on their breed and hair type. Special caution should be taken when grooming dogs with thick, double coats as trimming can disrupt their normal hair growth patterns. Check with your veterinarian or a professional groomer for advice.
- We do not recommend shaving your pet—both because using the clipper without a guard increases the risk of cutting or scratching your pet's skin and because shaving can put your pet at risk for a skin infection, sunburn, and even skin cancer. In addition, shaving your pet does not help them stay cool in the summer because your pet's fur helps them naturally regulate their body temperature.

# **USING THE NAIL GRINDER**

#### **↑** WARNINGS

- Use caution when trimming your pet's nails with the nail grinder to avoid accidentally cutting into the quick which can cause bleeding and be quite painful for your pet.
- If you have never trimmed your pet's nails before, seek guidance from your veterinarian or a professional groomer before attempting to do it yourself.
- 1. Connect the hose to the vacuum inlet and attach the electric clipper attachment to the hose.
- 2. Pull firmly on the clipper head to remove it and replace it with the nail grinder head. The grinder head will click into place. Refer back to *Figure 10* on page 15.
- 3. Press the **Power**  $\bigcirc$  **button** on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- 4. Press the Vacuum Mode W button to turn on the suction. Low suction intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 5. Press the green **Power () button** on the attachment to turn on the nail grinder.
- 6. Apply the grinder gently to one nail at a time. See Figure 12.
  - a. Go slowly to avoid trimming too much too guickly.
  - b. Keep a careful eye on the quick of the nail (the nerves and blood vessels inside the nail) to avoid hitting it, as this will hurt your pet.
- 7. Press the **Power button** on the attachment to turn off the grinder. Turn off the appliance, unplug it, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.



# **NOTES**

- If you accidentally trim to the quick, apply pressure to the bleeding nail with a tissue for at least 3 minutes to stop the bleeding. You can also apply styptic powder or a styptic pencil, as directed on the product, to the nail to stop the bleeding. Monitor the injured nail for bleeding or infection.
- Darker nails make it more difficult to see the quick. We recommend seeking guidance from your veterinarian or a professional groomer before attempting to trim dark nails yourself.
- The nail grinder has two sides: a large side for large pets and a small side for small pets.
- Make sure your pet's paws and nails are clean and dry before trimming.

# **CLEANING UP**



- 1. Connect the hose to the vacuum inlet and install an attachment. See Figure 13.
  - To remove pet hair from upholstered furniture or clothing, attach the multiuse brush to the end of the hose and install the upholstery brush head. See USING THE MULTIUSE BRUSH on page 12.

- b. To pick up pet hair, dust, allergens, and other debris, attach the crevice nozzle to the end of the hose.
- 2. Press the **Power** () button on the control panel to turn on the appliance.
- 3. Press the Vacuum Mode W button to turn on the suction. Low suction intensity is selected by default. Press the button a second time to choose medium intensity. Press a third time for high.
- 4. Turn off the appliance, unplug it, and allow it to cool before cleaning or storing.

# CHARGING THE ELECTRIC CLIPPER

To charge the clipper:

- 1. Make sure the electric clipper attachment is turned off and disconnected from the appliance.
- 2. Open the USB-C port on the clipper attachment and plug in the USB-C charging cable.
- 3. Plug the charging cable into a 5V–1A USB adapter and plug the USB adapter into an electrical outlet. The indicator LED will be red to indicate the clipper attachment is charging.
- 4. When the clipper attachment is fully charged, the indicator LED will turn green. Disconnect the charging cable and close the charging port cover securely. Do not overcharge.

#### NOTES

- The battery will take about 3.5 hours to charge. The average use time per charge is about 3 hours.
- During use, the indicator LED will flash red for 30 seconds and then turn off to indicate that the battery is low and needs to be charged.
- Never operate and charge the clipper at the same time.
- Always close the charging port cover securely to keep out moisture and avoid damage to the battery.
- The battery is not removable or replaceable.

# **CARE AND MAINTENANCE**

# WARNINGS

- On not allow water or other liquids to come into contact with the appliance. Do not soak or immerse the appliance in water or other liquids.
- Always turn off and unplug the appliance before performing any care or maintenance tasks, such as emptying the dust bin, removing the filter, or cleaning the clipper to avoid electric shock.
- Always ensure the dust cup and filters are completely dry before reinstallation to avoid electric shock or damage to the appliance.

# **EMPTYING AND CLEANING THE DUST BIN**

To empty the dust bin:

- 1. Power the appliance off, unplug the power cable, and remove the dust bin.
- 2. Lift the latch on the front of the dust bin to open the lid. See Figure 14.
- 3. Empty the dust bin in the trash, shaking carefully to loosen any fur or dirt clinging to the bin.
- 4. Reinstall the dust bin.



#### To clean the dust bin:

- 1. Power the appliance off, unplug the power cable, and remove the dust bin.
- 2. Wash the dust bin in warm, soapy water, then rinse it thoroughly.
- 3. Place the dust bin, with the lid open, in a well-ventilated location and allow to air dry for at least 24 hours.
- 4. Once the dust bin is completely dry, reinstall it.

# NOTES

- Empty the dust bin regularly. Do not overfill as this may affect performance or damage the product.
- Always properly dispose of the dust bin contents in the trash.
- We recommend cleaning the dust bin at least once per month. Always make sure the dust bin is completely dry before reinstalling.
- Consider wearing a mask when emptying or cleaning the dust bin to reduce your exposure to pet dander, dust, allergens, and other potential irritants, particularly if you have allergies or respiratory sensitivities.

# REMOVING AND CLEANING THE FILTERS



To remove and clean the filters:

- 1. Remove the dust bin following the instructions on the previous page.
- 2. Remove the HEPA filter by pulling gently from the center of the filter. You may need to gently wiggle it to loosen it. Remove the foam filter behind the HEPA filter. See *Figure 15*.
- Shake out the foam filter over a trash bin. Use a vacuum cleaner to remove dust and debris from the HEPA filter.
- 4. Rinse each filter under cool running water for 5 minutes.
- 5. Shake out the HEPA filter and squeeze the foam filter to remove excess water.
- 6. Place the filters in a well-ventilated location and allow them to air dry for at least 24 hours.
- 7. Once the filters are completely dry, reinstall them.
  - a. Press the foam filter into place.
  - b. Insert the HEPA filter over the foam filter.
  - c. Make sure both filters are fully seated.

**NOTES:** To keep the filters functioning optimally, clean them at least once per month. More frequent cleaning may be necessary depending on how often the appliance is used.

#### **CLEANING THE BRUSHES**

Clean the brushes regularly to minimize dust, allergens, and pathogens, and to reduce cross-contamination when using the brushes with multiple pets.

- Disconnect all brushes and brush heads.
- 2. Use a vacuum cleaner to remove any hair, dirt, or dust from the brushes and heads.
- 3. Rinse each brush and brush head under cool running water for 5 minutes to clean.
- 4. Lay the brushes and brush heads on a clean, dry towel with the teeth or pins facing down to drain water out and avoid mold growth. Allow the brushes to completely dry before using them again.

#### CLEANING THE CLIPPER AND LUBRICATING THE CLIPPER BLADES



To clean the electric clipper and lubricate the clipper blades:

- 1. Turn off and unplug the appliance, then remove the clipper attachment.
- 2. Remove the clipper head from the attachment body. See Figure 16.
- 3. Use the included clipper cleaning brush to remove any hair, dirt, or debris from the clipper blades as well as the head and body of the attachment.
- 4. Reassemble the electric clipper.
- 5. Apply 1–2 drops of lubricant to the teeth of the clipper blade.
- 6. Turn on the clipper for 10–20 seconds to evenly distribute the oil.
- 7. Use a soft, clean cloth to remove any excess oil.

## **NOTES**

- We recommend cleaning hair, dust, and debris from the clipper and blades after each use.
- We recommend lubricating the clipper blades after every 10 uses. Lubricating the blades helps keep them sharp, reduces friction, and ensures optimal performance.
- On not use other types of oil to lubricate the clipper blades; only use the included lubricating oil.
